

Sports Premium

The PE and sport premium funding is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils' The Department for Education are spending over £450 million on improving PE and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. Schools received PE and sport premium based on the number of pupils in Years 1-6 and schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

The Department for Education Vision is that:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport

Funding is provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

5 key indicators are used to measure progress against this objective as follows:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

As a school we also have objectives set out in our PE action plan which link to the DFE objectives and use of PE/ Sport premium. These are:

1. To strengthen the role of the PE subject leader
2. To audit the PE equipment
3. To develop use of ICT in PE
4. To implement new scheme - Real PE
5. To develop CPD opportunities for teaching staff
6. To develop young leaders in sports
7. To provide more opportunities for intra-mural sports
8. To provide more opportunities for inter-mural sports
9. To develop links with local sports clubs
10. To promote a healthy lifestyle
